Emergency Medical Technician Basic Course Course Description

This course fulfills all the training requirements set forth by the State of California in Title 22 of the Health and Safety Code for Emergency Medical Technicians. The EMT-B course is a hands-on, interactive experience. Upon successful completion of this course students will be eligible to take the National Registry exam. This can lead to employment in a wide range of job opportunities to include: Ambulance EMT, Firefighter EMT, Emergency Room Technician, Private Industry EMT, Special Events Standby EMT (sporting events, concerts, state and county fairs, etc.) and others.

During the course students are also assigned to a 10-hour ride along with AMR ambulance crews. During the session students perform patient assessments, assist with patient care (including CPR, C-Spine Immobilization, airway management, etc.) and ride with the crew to deliver patients to local hospitals.

Prerequisites

- Student must possess a BLS/CPR Healthcare Provider card (American Heart Association, ASHI, American Red Cross accepted) – NCTI offers a BLS Healthcare Provider course before each EMT-Basic course start date to fulfill this prerequisite.
- Be at least 18 years of age
- Have a High school diploma or GED certificate
